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




Rural Health Experience

The Rural Health Experience (RHE) is a three- to five-day rural immersion experience for health professions students interested in learning about the delivery of health care in a particular rural community.

The RHE is designed to:

- Provide experience in rural health care settings;
- · Acquaint students with rural lifestyle;
- Convey knowledge and appreciation for a variety of health professions disciplines;
- · Create awareness of rural health needs:
- Provide an opportunity for students to learn and work in an environment that supports health professionals working together; and
- Encourage awareness and acceptance of different cultures and promote learning through active and organized participation in the community.

RHE Goals

- To learn about the social and health characteristics, needs and resources of a specific rural community.
- To understand the roles and responsibilities of different health care providers in a rural community.
- To reflect on a future career as a health care provider in a rural community and potential interest in this location as a future career location.

Who is eligible?

- The ideal candidate is from a rural community and currently enrolled in a health professions program.
- Students who possess a strong interest in rural health care.
- Minimum qualifications are students who will have completed their sophomore year of undergraduate schooling by the start of the RHE. Preference goes to upperclassmen students and those already in graduate or professional programs.
